1. Approved minutes from May 20, 2020
2. Discussed there may be no need for July or August Zoom coalition meeting, will do follow up business via e-mail.
3. Theresa discussed several youth summer prevention programs provided by Westchester County, we will ask the Village and the school to send a blast out about the programs.
4. Theresa discussed the requirement from the CDC to draw down anticipated funds to cover the next three months of coalition activities because funds will not be available to us after June 30th. This is because of the conversion of the oversight of the DFC grant being switched from SAMSHA to the CDC.
5. We discussed items to be purchased per the grant from our carryover budget approval. Monique made a request to alter her wish list to include virtual goggles, and the request was denied. The reason being it cannot be tied sufficiently to substance prevention.
6. We discussed that Monique will not be making any videos for the coalition during her summer vacation, but Allison and Marissa offered to continue to make videos. We have sent e-mails out to other key leaders in the community for participation. To date, we received a submission from the Mayor, and the library has agreed to make a video for us too. We will follow up with other requests that have been sent.
7. Theresa expressed her lack of response from the school district pertaining to surveying the students in the fall, her plan is to send a final e-mail stating due to lack of response we are assuming the answer is no to surveying students. Theresa will keep us up to date on their response.
